

Conestoga Students Re: Support Staff Union Strike

A province-wide strike by Ontario college support staff is in effect as of 12:01 am, September 1.

All Conestoga campuses will remain open during this labour disruption. All day and evening classes will begin as scheduled on Tuesday, September 6, 2011. Students are expected to attend classes as usual. You will be required to cross a picket line when you come on campus.

When entering the campus, you are encouraged to use courtesy and caution when crossing the picket line. For further information, please review the picket line protocol.

Conestoga will do everything possible to ensure classroom activities are not interrupted and minimize disruptions to student services, given the constraints of the situation.

General Q's & A's

Q1. What is this strike all about?

A1. OPSEU, the union representing support staff at Ontario's 24 colleges, turned down a reasonable wage increase of 4.8% over three years. The union team continued to demand wages and benefits increases that are unaffordable for the colleges to provide.

Q2. Will Conestoga College campuses remain open during the strike?

A2. Yes. All Conestoga College campuses will remain open, all academic programs will be running, and your classes will start on September 6 as scheduled. Students will be expected to attend classes.

Q3. How will the strike affect other Conestoga staff?

A3. All faculty, administrators and non-full-time support staff will be expected to report for work as usual.

Q4. How will College services be affected by the strike?

A4. Conestoga will do everything possible to ensure classroom activities are not interrupted and to minimize disruptions to student services. For up-to date information on the availability of College services please click here.

Q5: Will students still be able to move into residence?

A5: Yes. The residence continues to be open. Move-in and all other residence activities will continue as scheduled.

Q6: Will food services be available during the work stoppage?

A6: Yes. All food service operations will continue as scheduled.

Q7: Will the bookstore be open during the work stoppage?

A7: Yes. Bookstore operations will continue. For revised hours, click here.

Q8: Will financial aid, including OSAP distribution, be available during the strike?

A8: Yes. The Registrar's office, including financial aid will be open. For revised hours, click here.

Q9: I am registered for a Continuing Education course at Conestoga this fall. How will my course be affected by the strike?

A10: CE courses at Conestoga will start on the scheduled dates published in the CE catalogue.

Q10: Will I be required to cross a picket line?

A10: During the work stoppage, you can expect that picket lines will be set up at the entrances to all Conestoga campuses. For instructions on how to cross the picket line safely, please consult our picket line protocol. Allow extra time for crossing the picket line to ensure you can get to class on time.

Q11: How does the strike affect the community's access to Conestoga facilities such as child care centres and the recreation complex?

Q11: The Child Care centres will be closed as a result of the work stoppage. The Recreation Centre and sports fields are also closed. The gymnasium is open for academic use only. For a full listing of services affected by the strike, please click here.
